2.4 Institutional commitment

The ISCTE - Instituto Universitário de Lisboa (ISCTE-IUL) is a high-guality public university institute and one of the most dynamic and innovative in Portugal, mainly in the areas of Management and Economics, Sociology and Public Policy, Social Sciences and Humanities, Information and Communication Technologies, and Architecture. ISCTE-IUL articulates education and research, mainly at the doctoral level, but also in the master's and undergraduate programmes being a research oriented university with a multi and inter -disciplinary approach, that includes 9 research units, 6 laboratories, as well as the 16 Departments and 4 Schools, that are the main organizational structures of the Institute (see www.iscte.pt). The research units of ISCTE-IUL, classified as decentralized organic units, have different levels of autonomy and are represented at the Institute's boards (namely at the Scientific Board). ISCTE-IUL fosters excellence, high quality and impact of research having a regular reward and recognition policy for research achievements. Since 2011, the top-notch research results are recognized and receive individual awards. The researchers and students at ISCTE-IUL have access to an international scientific atmosphere that promotes international exchanges and collaborations, through regular programmes for international post-graduate education, short-term visitors, international workshops and seminars, with an excellent international reputation. Moreover, the strong national and international cooperation of ISCTE-IUL with a large number of universities and research institutes as well as public, private and third sector organizations promotes, not only the scientific cooperation and the participation in trans-disciplinary research/advancing training programs, but also the cutting edge research. ISCTE-IUL organizational structure reflects the key contribution of research. A member of the Institute's top management (Rectory) is appointed to guide the research strategy. ISCTE-IUL has wide experience in training and mentoring researchers, in project management and quality processes services, having central support offices and specialized teams that support project management and quality management of services, such as the innovate projects' office, the research support office, which fosters internationalization of scientific research developed in the research units by providing assistance to their staff, the evaluation office, and the quality planning and finance department, which are articulated with stakeholders needs.

The ISCTE-IUL has Scientific and Ethics Advisory Boards that scrutinize the scientific progress and teaching programmes, as well as the recruitment and activity of the personnel and research groups.

Thus, ISCTE-IUL commits to provide the necessary environment, infrastructure, instruments and equipment to the researchers and to provide the facilities necessary to carry out the strategic programmes of the research units.

3. R&D UNIT DESCRIPTION AND ACHIEVEMENTS

3.1 Description of the R&D Unit

The goals set by the CIES-IUL for 2008-2012 were as follows:

a) To achieve the status of FCT Associate Laboratory (Associate Laboratory of Sociology and Public Policies) in order to sustain the centre's path of growth and excellence of the last 20 years

b) To foster the work of the different research groups, boosting current activities and addressing new issues on the contemporary scientific and public agenda

c) To enlarge, qualify and internationalize the research team

d) To continue to undertake a large number of national and international scientific research projects with funding
 e) To set up and develop two permanent research platforms: the Observatory of Inequalities and the Observatory of Emigration

f) To ensure the centre's participation in major international research consortia

g) To increase the team's international publication level and the international publication rate per researcher

h) To articulate research done at the centre with PhD Programmes teaching activities

i) To develop the centre's own publication channels

j) To continue to organise and participate in national and international scientific debate activities

k) To continue to undertake annually activities for the promotion of scientific culture

In order to achieve these goals, the centre has set an organisational model with a number of participants and has undertaken a wide variety of measures and actions:

a) Our organisational model is based on harmonious, effective articulation between the centre's governing and advisory bodies. In addition to the work of the director, who has two assistant directors, the Scientific Committee, which consists of four 4 researchers elected by their peers, plays an important role in giving advice and making strategic and management decisions. The research groups' coordinators articulate with the director and play an active part in motivating their teams to submit scientific proposals, while the director refers to them outside requests for research by their groups. Every year, the Scientific Council, which comprises all researchers with PhDs, examines the Report and Plan of Activities and issues an opinion on them. The work of the Permanent External Scientific Advisory Committee (made up of three Portuguese and two foreign researchers) includes paying annual visits to the centre and also issuing an opinion. An essential feature of the centre's organisational model is the researchers' freedom to propose new projects and other scientific activities. This culture of initiative is encouraged among the new generations of researchers arriving at CIES-IUL. The highly qualified support that the unit's technical and administrative staff provides to the research team is also very important.

b) Where the status of associate laboratory is concerned, in the previous FCT evaluation period in 2007 the international panel of assessors expressly recommended that it should be granted. CIES-IUL submitted a properly structured and detailed application to the FCT and received a favourable opinion in an ordinance from the Minister of Science, Technology and Higher Education on 23 March 2011. On 26 May 2011, the President of the FCT wrote to the director of the CIES-IUL informing him that contacts would start for the conclusion of an agreement with the FCT. No further progress was made after this due to a lack of response from the FCT and the Ministry.

c) Every year, the centre selected candidates to apply for FCT post-doc scholarships, "Ciência" and "Investigador FCT" contracts and "Welcome" scholarships. These selection processes attracted many Portuguese and foreign candidates and we were able to choose a good number of researchers with strong CV's, who received grants and contracts. Another form of international expansion for the team was the intake of a large number of visiting researchers who spent varying amounts of time at the centre. Where the team's qualifications are concerned, the centre encouraged research assistants to obtain PhDs and received dozens of applications for FCT grants, many of which were successful.
d) The research groups were strengthened with a large number of applications to the FCT's calls for research projects, European call programmes, such as the Seventh Framework Programme and calls from other Portuguese and international organisations. Many of the applications were successful. In many cases, even when the funding programmes did not require them, the applications involved partnerships with other institutions. CIES-IUL was

a member of major international consortia, such as the European Social Survey and the Programme for the International Assessment of Adult Competencies (PIAAC).

e) The following measures were taken to increase international publication by the team: funding for researchers to participate in international conferences provided that they subsequently submitted the paper to international journals, funding for translation of articles into English, annual publication targets for post-doc and doctoral scholarship holders and training sessions by centre researchers with experience of international publication and a foreign specialist.
f) Advanced training activities developed most when the centre took over the management and scientific coordination of four doctoral programmes: Sociology, Public Policies, Communication Sciences and Social Service in 2011. Besides those four programmes, CIES-IUL is associated with the doctoral programme in urban studies coordinated by Universidade Nova de Lisboa and joined the FCT doctoral programme, entitled Communication Studies: Technology, Culture and Society granted in 2013.

g) Another measure connecting research to advanced training is the "CIES-IUL Research Internships" in which undergraduate, master's and PhD students join ongoing projects.

h) The centre sponsored many national and international conferences, seminars and colloquies to foster a continuous environment of up-to-date scientific debate. They involved hundreds of participants from the centre and other Portuguese and foreign institutions.

i) Every year, CIES-IUL and Agência Ciência Viva organise promotional activities for the dissemination of research in sociology and other social sciences for upper secondary school students.

3.2 Major achievements

CIES-IUL celebrated its 25th anniversary in 2011 and has been a key centre in Portugal for a long time, especially in the field of sociology. All FCT evaluations have classified it as "Excellent". Over the years, the centre has expanded the scientific areas in which it works. Currently, in addition to its main field, sociology, the centre has well-established teams working in public policies, political science, communication sciences, education sciences and urban studies and a small social work team with growth potential.

In the five years analysed here, the centre established itself in Portugal as a large, highly competitive research unit in its work areas. It also considerably stepped up its international expansion by attracting foreign researchers, undertaking research projects in partnerships and publishing in international journals, a practice which has extended to the different generations of researchers in the team.

The centre has reinforced a distinctive trait in Portuguese research units, in that it not only conducts fundamental research in established fields but also addresses new issues and conducts applied research associated with the design, implementation, monitoring and assessment of public policies.

The centre has developed the association between research and advanced training by coordinating four doctoral programmes and being associated with other two. CIES-IUL's record in the training of new generations of researchers is also highly positive, as it has hosted many dozens of candidates for FCT doctoral scholarships, most of whom received their grants.

The centre's researchers organised and participated in a very large number of national and international scientific meetings. During the period, it was common practice among the younger generations of researchers to attend international conferences, colloquies and seminars, where they presented papers and set up fruitful contact networks with peers from other countries.

CIES-IUL also strengthened its own publication channels, which places it in a prominent position in Portugal. Another highly positive point is that the centre has kept up a consistent practice of organising activities for the promotion of scientific culture every year that is unique among social science research centres in Portugal. More specifically, the main results achieved by CIES-IUL from 2008 to 2012 were:

a) There was considerable growth in the number of researchers with PhDs from 56 in 2008 to 110 in 2012, with an increasingly international team of PhDs.

b) We obtained a large number of post-doc FCT grants and research contracts in competitive calls. The number of post-doc grant holders went from 13 in 2008 to 30 in 2012. The centre issued international calls to select candidates to apply for these grants, which attracted high-level Portuguese and foreign researchers. Many of the centre's choices received FCT grants. In 2012 there eight PhDs with contracts under the Compromisso com a Ciência Programme, one PhD with a Marie Curie grant and another with an FCT Welcome grant. The centre was also awarded two new contracts in the Investigador FCT Programme, one in 2012 and the other in 2013.

c) The founding of the CIES-UBI unit with eight PhD sociology researchers at Beira Interior University was another significant development as it enlarged the team and placed the centre at another university in a different region.
d) There are dozens of funded research projects under way every year and more and more of them are international in scope. CIES researchers participated in three projects funded by the 5° Framework Program; five projects funded by the 6ª Framework Program; and nine projects funded by the 7° Framework Program, some of which are still ongoing or starting.

e) Two permanent research platforms in fields where CIES-IUL is an institution of reference in Portugal and abroad were strengthened: the Observatory of Inequalities and the Observatory of Emigration. Today they have a substantial wealth of data, studies and analyses that is available to researchers, students and the general public.

f) Permanent training of new researchers, .e.g. by taking in applicants for FCT doctoral grants. The number of PhD students with FCT scholarships rose from 28 in 2008 to 59 in 2012.

g) International publication grew, especially in peer-reviewed journals indexed in key databases (WoK and SCOPUS).
h) A growing number of foreign researchers came to the centre to spend varying lengths of time there or attend scientific meetings and PhD programme conferences. The centre received 116 foreign researchers in 2012.
i) There was growing articulation between research and advanced training. CIES-IUL took on four doctoral programmes from the ISCTE-IUL School of Sociology and Public Policies in 2011 (Sociology, Public Policies, Communication Sciences and Social Work) and is associated with other two. These programmes are attended by more than 100 PhD students, most of whom have FCT scholarships and/or belong to the unit's research teams. Sociology, the oldest of these programmes, began in 2003 and many theses have already been defended, including 56 in the last three years.
j) There was substantial development in CIES-IUL's own channels of publication. They currently include the journal Sociologia, Problemas e Práticas, which has been published three times a year since 1986 and is indexed in SCOPUS; the Portuguese Journal of Social Science, published since 2002 by the British publisher Intellect, where CIES belongs to the consortium (also indexed in SCOPUS); Editora Mundos Sociais, founded in 2010, which publishes the journal Sociologia, Problemas e Práticas and peer-reviewed books in the fields of Sociology, Political Science, Anthropology and Social and Organisational Psychology and has released 36 titles since 2010 in three collections; and the CIES e-Working Papers collection, which began in 2005 and has so far published 166 articles.

5.2 Overall description of indicators and research outputs/Highlights

The above table reflects the Centre's trajectory of growth, consolidation, excellence and internationalization in the last five years. About the indicators presented in it the following aspects should be underlined:

a) The number of integrated researchers practically doubled between 2008 and 2012, from 56 to 110. In 2012, 22% of the integrated researchers were foreign, from 16 different countries. All together the integrated researchers, associated researchers (40) and research assistants (110) make up a team of 266. The Centre is therefore a large unit with an increasingly qualified team and a good level of internationalization.

b) The size, qualifications and internationalization of the team are reflected directly by its productivity. Every year there were dozens of national and international research projects under way. In 2012, 13 of the 54 projects were international in terms of the team members and source of funding. The projects shown in the table above are just those in which the research teams received funding in competitive calls or by order from public or private institutions. The size of these projects' budgets demonstrates the team's ability to raise finance. Between 2008 and 2012, the total average budget of ongoing projects was 1.5 million euros. If we add this type of project to individual projects undertaken as part of PhD and post-doc scholarships, the numbers go up considerably. In 2012, 59 FCT PhD grant holders and 30 FCT postdoc grant holders were working at the Centre. Also in 2012, the last year in which the FCT issued a call for research projects in all scientific fields, 10 of the Centre's projects were selected for funding. Five of them were headed by Centre researchers and the other five were partnerships with other institutions. Funding constraints of recent years have prevented more projects being approved. In the same FCT call in 2012, several of the projects submitted by Centre researchers that were not selected for funding were classified as "excellent" or "very good". This means that the reason for their rejection was the FCT's budgetary limitations rather than lack of scientific merit. In 2013, 22 new funded projects began, five of which are international.

c) The size and quality of the CIES-IUL team is also reflected in its publication figures. The number of scientific articles published in international peer-reviewed journals went from 39 in 2008 to 84 in 2012, growth of over 100%. Furthermore, in addition to the total increase in articles, there have also been more published in high-impact journals high in the rankings of their scientific areas. Books and book chapters of international distribution increased from 18 to 48. Both these figures are extremely positive. In addition to these international publications, those published in Portugal (articles in journals, books, book chapters, etc) have also increased constantly. Another indication regarding the team's record is publication rate per researcher. Considering the number of full-time integrated researchers (71.7 in 2012), the ratio of articles in international journals per researcher was 1.2, having shown growth throughout the period. Increasing publication of international articles has meant not only exposure and scientific capital but also research funding. In

2010, the ISCTE-IUL Rector's Office introduced research awards for articles published in WoK journals of the 1° and 2° quartile and several Centre researchers have won them since then.

d) The Centre's team does important work in training new generations of researchers by supervising doctoral theses. Dozens of theses supervised by research team members were completed in the period, going from 5 in 2008 to 15 in 2012. Many of them were completed in doctoral programmes coordinated by the Centre, with others being done at other Portuguese or foreign institutions. In addition to supervision of doctoral theses, the team also supervised post-doc projects. In 2012, CIES-IUL researchers were responsible for 32, more than twice those in 2008 (14).
e) The Centre has a technical and administrative staff that has grown slowly over the years and currently consists of nine people, who are in charge of financial management, science management, administrative management, communication and image and doctoral programme management. This is a highly qualified staff, all of whom have undergraduate or master's degrees in the appropriate areas. The support that they provide to the research team is essential to the unit's operation. In articulation with ISCTE-IUL they are offered the opportunities to update their competencies through regular training activities.

6. SCIENTIFIC COMPONENT - STRATEGIC PROGRAMME 2015/2020

6.1 Abstract in Portuguese for publication

O CIES-IUL projeta-se estrategicamente para o futuro na continuidade de um trajeto bem-sucedido de muitos anos que o conduziu ao patamar em que está hoje. É um centro de investigação de excelência, de grande dimensão, competitivo, crescentemente internacionalizado, que tem na investigação sociológica e no estudo das políticas públicas os seus domínios principais e incorpora também investigadores de ciência política, ciências da comunicação, ciências da educação, estudos urbanos e serviço social. A integração, a partir de 2015, de um grupo de investigadores de referência de História Moderna e Contemporânea alargará ainda mais o campo de ação do Centro. O CIES-IUL, que reúne a maior equipa de sociólogos altamente qualificados a nível nacional, visa manter a sociologia como área científica principal e reforçar o seu papel liderante em temas como as desigualdades, as migrações, a sociedade do conhecimento e da informação, a sociologia da família e da juventude, a sociologia da saúde, os comportamentos políticos. Neste contexto, é fundamental a consolidação do trabalho do Observatório das Desigualdades e do Observatório da Emigração, duas plataformas permanentes de pesquisa de referência nacional. O programa estratégico passa também por continuar a realizar estudos aplicados à conceção, desenho, implementação, monotorização e avaliação de políticas públicas, que constituem um sólido património de pesquisa acumulado ao longo dos anos e um traço distintivo do CIES-IUL.

O Centro manterá equipas de investigação fortes nos domínios da ciência política, ciências da comunicação, ciências da educação e estudos urbanos e desenvolverá a área de investigação em serviço social, fazendo crescer o pequeno grupo de investigadores hoje existente. O novo grupo de História Moderna e Contemporânea será dinamizado e estimular-se-á a cooperação interdisciplinar.

O CIES-IUL combina de forma sistemática investigação com formação avançada através da coordenação científica de 4 Programas de Doutoramento (Sociologia, Políticas Públicas, Ciências da Comunicação, Serviço Social) e da associação a mais dois (Estudos Urbanos e um Programa de Doutoramento FCT em Estudos de Comunicação). Esses programas têm atraído um número crescente de alunos, o que, além de permitir reforçar as atividades de formação avançada, dá oportunidades de aumentar e renovar a equipa de investigação. No caso da sociologia, o Programa mais antigo, isso já acontece de modo expressivo, com a incorporação de numerosos doutorados na equipa. O mesmo é esperável nos próximos anos relativamente aos restantes Programas, mais recentes. Através dos "Estágios de Investigação CIES-IUL" o Centro faz também um trabalho de integração de estudantes do 1º e do 2º ciclo em atividades de investigação, que será reforçado.

O CIES-IUL tem feito um caminho consistente de internacionalização e esse é outro vetor estratégico a reforçar, a vários níveis: continuar a atrair investigadores estrangeiros, que hoje já representam uma parte importante da equipa; continuar a aumentar o número de projetos com financiamento internacional, que tem crescido consideravelmente; continuar a aumentar a publicação de artigos em revistas científicas com revisão de pares bem cotadas nos rankings internacionais; continuar a aumentar o acolhimento de investigadores visitantes; manter o alto nível de participação e organização de encontros científicos internacionais já atingido; recrutar mais alunos e professores estrangeiros para os seus programas de doutoramento.

Os meios de publicação científica, bem como as atividades regulares de promoção da cultura científica, são componentes essenciais de afirmação de uma unidade de investigação com a dimensão e o prestígio do CIES-IUL. Nesse sentido, faz parte do programa estratégico consolidar os canais próprios de publicação científica (Revista Sociologia Problemas e Práticas, participação no Portuguese Journal of Social Science, Editora Mundos Sociais e CIES e-Working Papers) e manter as atividades anuais de promoção da cultura científica organizadas com a Agência Ciência Viva, destinadas a estudantes do ensino secundário e outros públicos.

Para a implementação do programa estratégico 2015-2020 o Centro definiu 6 conjuntos de medidas, boa parte das quais já está em curso: medidas de consolidação das áreas científicas do Centro e do trabalho científico da equipa e dos grupos de investigação; medidas de internacionalização; medidas de estímulo à publicação; medidas de ligação entre investigação e formação avançada; medidas de desenvolvimento dos canais próprios de publicação; medidas de promoção da cultura científica

Para executar esta estratégia o Centro dispõe de um modelo organizacional bem definido e eficaz. Os órgãos de decisão, Diretor e Subdiretores, mantêm uma articulação estreita com a Comissão Científica (Diretor mais 4 investigadores), que tem também, em algumas áreas, funções de decisão, além de um papel de aconselhamento e de pensamento estratégico da unidade. Por outro lado, os coordenadores de grupos de investigação e o coordenador do pólo CIES-UBI são investigadores de referência para as respetivas equipas e estão em articulação estreita com o Diretor e os Subdiretores. Um elemento-chave do modelo organizacional do Centro é a cultura de iniciativa dos investigadores na proposição de projetos e outras atividades científicas, que se deseja manter, e que coexiste harmoniosamente com a estrutura organizativa e de decisão descrita. Duas instâncias de aconselhamento importantes são o Conselho Científico, que aprecia e aprova os Relatórios e Planos de Atividades Anuais, e a Comissão Externa Permanente de Aconselhamento Científico.

Desenvolvendo pesquisa de qualidade em domínios socialmente relevantes e tendo competências específicas consolidadas no estudo das políticas públicas, o Centro faz um importante trabalho de transferência de conhecimento para as instituições e a comunidade em geral.

6.2 Abstract in English for evaluation

Strategically, CIES-IUL is preparing for the future by continuing to pursue a long-standing and successful course that has brought it to the level at which it finds itself today. It is a large-scale, competitive and increasingly internationalized Centre of excellence, whose main spheres are sociological research and the study of public policy. It also possesses researchers in the fields of political science, communication sciences, education sciences, urban studies and social work. The inclusion of a group of key researchers in modern and contemporary history, from 2015, will extend even further the Centre's field of action.

CIES-IUL, which has brought together the largest team of highly qualified sociologists in the country, aims to retain sociology as a major scientific area and reinforce its leading role in thematic fields such as social inequalities, migration, the information and knowledge society, the sociology of youth and the family, the sociology of health, and political behaviour. Against this background, it is of fundamental importance to consolidate the work of the Observatory of Inequalities and the Observatory of Emigration, two permanent research platforms of national significance. The strategic programme also includes the continuing preparation of studies applied to the planning, design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of public policies. These studies represent a substantial wealth of research accumulated over the years and are a distinctive feature of CIES-IUL.

The Centre plans to maintain strong research teams in the fields of political science, communication sciences, education sciences and urban studies. It will also develop the research area of social work by expanding the small group of researchers that exists today. The work of the new group of researchers in Modern and Contemporary History will be supported and interdisciplinary cooperation will be encouraged.

CIES-IUL systematically combines research with advanced training, through the scientific coordination of 4 PhD programmes (Sociology, Public Policy, Communication Sciences and Social Work) and through its association with 2 other PhD programmes (Urban Studies and an FCT programme in Communication Studies). These programmes have attracted a growing number of students, which not only allows the Centre to expand advanced training activities but also provides opportunities to increase and renew the research team. In the case of sociology, the oldest programme, this is already visible on a considerable scale, with the integration of a large number of PhDs into the team. In the next few years, the same may be expected with the remaining - more recent - programmes. Through the "CIES-IUL Research Internships" the Centre also integrates 1st and 2nd cycle students into research activities. This will be expanded.

CIES-IUL has consistently followed a course of internationalization and this is another strategic direction to be developed at different levels, by: continuing to attract foreign researchers, who already represent an important part of the team; continuing to raise the number of projects with international funding, which has grown considerably; continuing to expand the publication of peer-reviewed articles in scientific journals with a high international ranking; continuing to increase the number of visiting researchers; maintaining the existing high level of participation in and the organization of international scientific meetings; recruiting more foreign students and teaching staff to its PhD programmes.

The means to produce scientific publications, in addition to regular activities to promote scientific culture, are essential components in the projection of a research unit with the dimension and prestige of CIES-IUL. For this reason, part of the strategic programme consists of consolidating the Centre's own scientific publication channels (the journal Sociologia Problemas e Práticas, participation in the Portuguese Journal of Social Science, the publisher Editora Mundos Sociais, and the CIES e-Working Papers) and maintaining its annual activities promoting scientific culture, organized with Agência Ciência Viva for secondary school students and other publics.

To implement the strategic programme for 2015-2020, the Centre has defined 6 sets of measures, a fair part of which are already in place: measures to consolidate the Centre's scientific fields and the scientific work of the team and the research groups; measures for internationalization; measures to stimulate publication; measures to link research and advanced training; measures to develop the Centre's own publication channels; measures to promote scientific culture. To apply this strategy, the Centre possesses a well-defined and effective organizational model.

The decision-making authorities, the director and sub-directors, co-operate closely with the Scientific Committee (the director plus 4 researchers), which also has decision-making functions in certain areas, an advisory function and a role in the strategic reflection of the unit. Furthermore, the research groups' coordinators and the CIES-UBI coordinator are key researchers for their teams and co-operate closely with the director and sub-directors. A crucial element in the Centre's organizational model is the culture in which researchers take the initiative in proposing projects and other scientific activities - a culture we wish to maintain and one that coexists harmoniously with the organizational and decision-making structure described. Two important advisory bodies are the Scientific Committee, which appraises and

approves the Annual Activity Reports and Plans, and the Permanent External Scientific Advisory Committee. The Centre performs high-quality research in socially important fields and has specific and established competences in the study of public policy. On this basis, it carries out important work in the transfer of knowledge to institutions and the community in general.

6.3 Strategy and vision of the unit and future management

CIES-IUL's strategic programme for the future is to continue its successful trajectory of many years' standing, which has brought to where it is today. It is a large, competitive research Centre of excellence with a growing level of internationalization. Sociology and public policy are its leading areas, which make it unique in Portugal, though it also has teams of researchers in political science, communication sciences, education sciences, urban studies and social work. CIES-IUL systematically combines research and advanced training by coordinating doctoral programmes, which give it great potential for expansion and renewal of the research team.

These are the essential features of the Centre today and they are the foundation for our strategy for 2015-2020. CIES-IUL has the largest group of sociology researchers in Portugal. The majority of the 119 integrated researchers registered by the unit in the first phase of this evaluation are sociologists. The Centre's heritage of experience and sociological research results, with hundreds of projects completed over the years won in competitive calls, place it in an excellent position in Portugal and abroad in the field. The Centre's inclusion in the ISCTE-IUL School of Sociology and Public Policy, the oldest, largest and most prestigious institution for the teaching of sociology in Portugal has reinforced this position.

Sociology is one of the social sciences that have been able to produce important results for justifying and assessing policies in different areas of contemporary societies. Over the years, via calls or direct requests, the Centre has undertaken countless applied studies that constitute a solid wealth of research into the planning, design, implementation, monitoring and assessment of public policies. The Centre's strategy includes stepping up our capacity to conduct this type of study.

Though sociology and public policy are its main fields, the Centre has competences in other social sciences - political science, communication sciences, education sciences and urban studies - which have been accumulating scientific capital and gaining competitive capacity in Portugal and abroad. The existence of a small social work team with medium-term growth potential is also an asset to CIES-IUL. Furthermore, the incorporation of a highly qualified group of researchers in Modern and Contemporary History in 2015 will extend the Centre's field of action even further. CIES-IUL today plays a leading role in Portugal and enjoys a growing international reputation in certain areas of research that is wishes to maintain and further improve. This is another strategic route. Social inequalities, migration, the knowledge and information society, sociology of the family and sociology of youth, sociology of health and political behavior, are examples of these fields. The foundation and strengthening of the Inequality Observatory of Inequalities and the Observatory of Emigration are a consequence of this capacity.

Year after year, the Centre has followed a consistent path towards internationalization and this is another strategic that we wish to reinforce at different levels: attracting foreign researchers, international funding for research projects, international publication, especially in peer-reviewed journals, visiting researchers, participation in key international meetings, recruitment of foreign students and professors for our doctoral programmes.

The fact that the Centre is responsible for the scientific coordination of four doctoral programmes (Sociology, Public Policy, Communication Sciences and Social Work) and is associated with other two (Urban Studies and

Communication Studies) gives it the opportunity to link research and advanced training, which it will develop further in the future. A good part of the dozens of PhDs graduating from the sociology doctoral programme today belong to our research team and this trend will continue. The Centre will work towards this with graduates from other more recent programmes. The PhD in public policy in particular also has dozens of students and, as they complete their theses, the Centre's response capacity in this key area of its research strategy will grow.

Scientific publication channels and regular promotion of scientific culture are essential components for a research unit with the size and prestige of CIES-IUL. It is therefore part of the Centre's strategy to improve its own publication channels (the journal Sociologia Problemas e Práticas, participation in the Portuguese Journal of Social Science, Editora Mundos Sociais and CIES e-Working Papers) and keep up the activities for the promotion of scientific culture organized with Agência Ciência Viva for upper-secondary school students and other audiences.

The Centre has a well-defined, effective organisational model to execute this strategy that requires only minor adjustments.

The decision-makers, director and assistant directors, are in close articulation with the Scientific Committee (the director plus four researchers), which also has powers of decision in some areas and contributes advice and strategic thought to the unit. The group coordinators are key researchers for their teams and articulate closely with the director and assistant directors. One key element of the Centre's organizational structure is its culture of freedom for researchers to propose projects and other scientific activities, which we wish to maintain and which coexists harmoniously with the formal organization and decision-making model.

Two important advisory bodies are the Scientific Council, which examines and approves the Report and Plan of Activities, and the Permanent External Scientific Advisory Committee, which pays annual visits to the Centre, examines the reports and issues opinions that are very important to the Centre's strategic orientation. The CIES-UBI unit, which was set up recently (see section 3.2, c)), has its own coordinator, who works in articulation with the Centre's director. The members of this unit are distributed across the different research groups. One point with room for improvement is the research groups' joint work dynamic, which can be achieved by instituting group meetings during the year.

6.4 Laboratory intensity level of the unit

Medium

Laboratory intensity level Justification

The intensity of CIES-IUL's laboratory work is medium. Databases of national and European value are essential to the Centre's work.

Two large sets of databases are those of the Observatory of Inequalities and the Observatory of Emigration. The data on both websites are available for researchers, students and for media and general public.

The Observatory of Inequalities (where CIES-IUL's partners are Instituto de Sociologia at Porto University and Centro de Estudos Sociais at University of the Azores) has vast amounts of quantitative data for Portugal and Europe on a wide variety of social inequalities, analyses about the evolution of various inequality indicators, statistical documents, news, interviews and a large Portuguese and international bibliography.

The Observatory of Emigration has systematic data on Portuguese immigrants in all the countries of the world, changes in their numbers over the years and their demographic profiles. It also offers analyses of emigration per country, a broad collection of news items on Portuguese emigration, interviews with specialists and public authorities and a large Portuguese and international bibliography on Portugal's emigrants in the world.

There has been a growing demand for the data from these two Observatories from researchers, students and journalists.

CIES-IUL also has a third permanent research and information platform, the Portuguese Observatory of Good Labour Practices (OPBPL). Although in smaller amounts than the other two Observatories, the OPBPL periodically provides documental and statistical information on the state of labour relations in Portugal.

In addition to the three platforms that it coordinates, CIES-IUL is involved in partnerships with other Portuguese and foreign research units to produce scientific databases of value to Portugal and other European countries. One of these partnerships is with the European Social Survey (ESS), in which the Centre has participated since the beginning as a partner of Instituto de Ciências Sociais at Lisbon University (ICS-UL), which coordinates Portugal's contribution to the ESS. The Centre is also in a partnership with Arquivo Português de Informações Sociais (APIS), coordinated by ICS-UL too. In addition to CIES-IUL, other partners are Centro de Estudos Sociais at Coimbra University, CESNOVA at Universidade Nova de Lisboa and Centro de Estudos Geográficos at Lisbon University. The APIS offers databases from completed research projects as well as the methodological information on how to use them.

6.5 General objectives

The CIES-IUL's general goals for 2015-2020 are listed below and are the result of the Centre's strategy described in Point 6.3.

a)To maintain CIES-IUL as a major, competitive, increasingly international Centre of excellence in the area of sociology and other social sciences

b)To maintain and if possible enlarge the Centre's team of full-time integrated researchers. Although CIES-IUL might already be considered a large unit for the social sciences standard, it has potential for increasing the number of researchers involved in funded projects, particularly those from new generations

c)To keep up its capacity to attract foreign researchers to the research team for extended periods

d)To maintain sociology as the Centre's main scientific area, in which CIES-IUL plays a leading role in Portugal and has a growing international reputation. The fact that CIES-IUL is responsible for scientific coordination of the ISCTE-IUL Doctoral Programme in Sociology, which has produced a large number of PhDs and continues to be in high demand, guarantees our ability to continue taking on new sociologists for the team.

e)To step up the Centre's work in the field of public policy, the second area in which it has the most experience and potential. CIES-IUL's wealth of research is unique in Portugal and points to continued key work on old and new issues related to the design, implementation and evaluation of public policy in different spheres of collective life. The fact that the Centre is responsible for the scientific coordination of the ISCTE-IUL Doctoral Programme in Public Policy, currently attended by several dozen students, means that the Centre will soon be able to take in new PhDs to step up our work in the area.

f)To maintain strong research teams in the fields of political science, communication sciences, education sciences and urban studies. CIES-IUL's scientific coordination of the ISCTE-IUL Doctoral Programme in Communication Sciences, its status as a partner in the FCT Doctoral Programme in Communication Studies: Technology, Culture and Society and also in the Doctoral Programme in Urban Studies of the Universidade Nova de Lisboa, enable the Centre to attract new PhDs in these fields.

g)To develop research into Social Work. This is a new area at the Centre and has strategic value and great potential for collaboration with sociology. It still has few researchers, but CIES-IUL's coordination of the ISCTE-IUL Doctoral Programme in Social Work offers prospects for enlarging the team.

h)To integrate and assist the new research group in Modern and Contemporary History, which will join the Centre in January 2015. The group is an interdisciplinary scientific asset for CIES-IUL and the Centre's experience in raising funding for research can boost its work.

i)To cement CIES-IUL's role in research areas in which it plays a leading role in Portugal and enjoys growing international prestige, such as social inequalities, migration, the knowledge and information society, sociology of family and youth, sociology of health, and the study of political behaviour. The consolidation of these areas may include

building new permanent research platforms similar to the Observatory of Inequalities and the Observatory of Emigration.

j)To continue to undertake a large number of national and international research projects on relevant scientific and social issues.

k)To ensure the continued work and funding of the Observatory of Inequalities and the Observatory of Emigration. I)To maintain the consolidation achieved by the different research groups and their capacity for theoretic, thematic and methodological innovation.

m)To keep as many or more foreign researchers on the Centre's team as in 2012 (22% of the integrated researchers were foreign).

n)To continue to increase the number of projects with international funding won by Centre researchers in broad European partnerships. As part of the Horizon 2020 programme, the Centre plans to win a number of projects in line with the 5th, 6th and 7th Framework Programmes (3, 5 and 9 funded projects)

o)To increase the overall number of international publications, especially in peer-reviewed journals well placed in international rankings, and the publication rate per researcher. To maintain a high level of other types of publication, such as Portuguese and international books and book chapters, namely in the fields where they are an enshrined standard.

p)To keep up the close connection between research and advanced training, by maintaining scientific coordination of the Doctoral Programmes in Sociology, Public Policy, Communication Sciences and Social Work and partnerships in the FCT Doctoral Programme in Communication Studies: Technology, Culture and Society and in the Doctoral Programme in Urban Studies of the Universidade Nova de Lisboa.

q)To build on the connection to research by 1st and 2nd cycle students, which is already done presently but only in a limited way.

r)To strengthen CIES-IUL's own publication channels, by i) boosting the internationalization of the journal Sociologia, Problemas and Práticas, helped by its recent inclusion in the SCOPUS database, ii) contributing to the growing reputation of the Portuguese Journal of Social Science (also recently indexed in SCOPUS), participating actively in its scientific coordination and contributing to its funding, iii) strengthening Editora Mundos Sociais, extending the catalogue of published authors and ensuring the widest possible distribution of its books and iv) keeping up the pace of publication of the CIES e-Working Papers collection, which already has 166 papers published.

s)To keep up annual activities for the promotion of scientific culture in collaboration with Agência Ciência Viva for upper-secondary students and other audiences.

6.6 Implementation

The implementation plan for CIES-IUL's strategy for 2015-2020 and its goals includes six sets of measures. A good part of them are under way at the Centre and will continue. Others are new. Achievement of our strategic goals is sustained by the Centre's management and organization model described in Point 6.3.

1.Measures for reinforcing the Centre's scientific areas and team and research groups' work

These measures are to achieve goals a) to n) in Point 6.5. They are:

a)Keeping up the practice of submitting a large number of applications for funding of research projects in the areas of the Centre's competencies

b)Ensuring that the most qualified researchers and teams in each area submit high-quality applications c)Ensuring that researchers or teams who had poor evaluations in projects submitted for funding reformulate the projects before resubmitting them

d)Keeping up the practice of seeking systematically sources of research funding

e)Increasing participation of Centre researchers in European consortia applying for funding of projects, namely in Horizon 2020.

f)Continuing to respond with the best teams and researchers to requests from government bodies for public policy research

g)Continuing to respond with the best teams and researchers to requests from private organizations for research within the Centre's areas.

h)Helping researchers and high-potential research assistants in seeking individual funding (PhD grants, post-doc grants, individual research contracts) to ensure their continuation in the team.

i)Conducting annual selection processes for choosing the researchers that will apply via CIES-IUL to national and international calls for post-doc grants or individual research contracts.

j)Continuing to accept high-quality researchers coming to the Centre with good research proposals and giving them the opportunity to apply for funding through CIES-IUL.

k)Setting up a formal system for accepting post-doc researchers at the Centre in addition to those who have FCT post-doc grants.

I)Encouraging high-potential PhDs graduating from the Centre's four doctoral programmes to join the research team, giving them the opportunity to apply for post-doc grants and individual research contracts and allowing them to join current research projects or to submit new projects that can fund them.

m)Ensuring that CIES-IUL maintains its position in fields in which it plays a leading role in Portugal, such as social inequalities, migration, the knowledge and information society, sociology of family and youth, sociology of health, study of political behavior, via applications to calls for research projects, the admission of researchers and publications. n)Ensuring that the Observatory of Inequalities and the Observatory of Emigration have the funding and scientific

conditions that they need. In October 2013, CIES-IUL submitted a joint application from the two Observatories to the FCT call "Roteiro Nacional de Infraestruturas de Investigação 2013".

Measures a) and b), d) to j), l) and m) are permanent and will continue in 2015-2020. Measures c) and k) will be implemented in 2014. Measure n) is partially under way and is waiting for the result of the application.

2.Measures for Internationalization

These measures are to achieve goals a), c), i), j), m), n), o) and r) in Point 6.5. They are:

a)Continuing to attract foreign researchers for short-listing of candidates for post-doc grants and individual research contracts from national and international sources

b)Ensuring that the best foreign researchers on the team have opportunities to apply for individual and project funding so that they can remain at the Centre

c)Increasing the number of applications from Centre researchers and teams for international funding of research projects inside and outside Europe

d)Keeping up researchers' high participation in international networks

e)Keeping up researchers' high participation in international meetings

f) Continuing to host foreign visiting researchers during stays of varying length

g)Continuing to host and organize international scientific events

h)Keeping up current measures to increase researchers' international publications (see "Measures for fostering publication").

All these measures are under way and will continue in 2015-2020.

3. Measures for fostering publication

These measures are to achieve goal o) in Point 6.5. They are:

a)Enforcing commitments signed by PhD and post-doc grant holders at the Centre to meet publication targets and extend them to new researchers joining the team.

b)Supporting participation by researchers in international conferences, within the limits of available funding, on the condition that they submit their paper to an international scientific journal.

c)Supporting translation of articles for publication in international scientific journals, within the limits of available funding. d)Increasing support for participation in international conferences by researchers who publish most, within the limits of available funding

e)Reserving the status of integrated researcher to those who meet minimum annual publication requirements (one scientific book or one book chapter or one article in a peer-reviewed journal)

f)Organizing new training sessions on international publication practices for researchers and research assistants. Measures a) to c) are under way and will continue in 2015-2020. Measures d) to f) will be implemented in 2014.

4. Measures for linking research and advanced training

These measures are to achieve goals p) and q) in Point 6.5. They are:

a)Continuing scientific coordination of the Doctoral Programmes in Sociology, Public Policy, Communication Sciences and Social Work

b)Keeping up the Centre's partnerships in the FCT Doctoral Programme in Communication Studies: Technology, Culture and Society and in the Doctoral Programme in Urban Studies of the Universidade Nova de Lisboa c)Setting up partnerships with other national and international doctoral programmes (in articulation with the board of

ISCTE-IUL' School of Sociology and Public Policy) for the exchange of doctoral students, professors and study units. d)Hosting other doctoral programmes within the Centre's scientific fields

e)Continuing to accept intentions to apply for FCT PhD grants and short-listing those who will apply with CIES-IUL as their host institution

f)Increasing and extending to 3rd cycle students the number of "CIES-IUL Research Internships". These internships began in 2012 and have been an effective way of involving 1st and 2nd cycle students in research.

Measures a) and b) are under way and will continue in 2015-2020. Measure c) will begin in 2014. Measure e) is partially in place and short-listing of candidates will begin in 2014. Measure f) is under way and will be stepped up in 2014. Measure d) will be proposed to the board of the School of Sociology and Public Policy in 2014.

5.Measures for the development of CIES-IUL's own publication channels

These measures are to achieve goal r) in Point 6.5. They are:

a)Guaranteeing continued four-monthly publication of the journal Sociologia, Problemas and Práticas and its international level

b)Continuing active participation in the ISCTE-IUL consortium that manages the Portuguese Journal of Social Science c)Keeping up the pace of publication by Editora Mundos Sociais at an average of 10 to 12 books a year and diversifying the disciplinary, institutional, regional and national origins of authors published d)Beginning publication of scientific e-books

e)Keeping up the pace of publication of the CIES e-Working Papers collection

Measures a) to c) and e) are under way and will continue in 2015-2020. Measure d) will be put in place in 2015.

6.Measures for the promotion of scientific culture

These measures are to achieve goal s) in Point 6.5. They are:

a)Hosting classes of upper-secondary sociology students for contact with the Centre and its researchers every year for one day in Science and Technology Week

b)Hosting groups of upper-secondary students for two weeks in the summer holiday as part of the "Ocupação Científica dos Jovens nas Férias", a programme of Agência Ciência Viva for introduction to research

c)Promoting scientific culture activities for audiences other than upper-secondary students

d)Continuing participation by the Centre's researchers in debates, round tables, conferences and other events for non-specialized audiences

e)Continuing participation of researchers in the media

Measures a), b) d) and e) have already been implemented and will continue in 2015-2020. Measure b) has been used mainly in sociological research but will be extended to other scientific fields at the Centre as of 2014. Measure c) will begin in 2015.

6.7 Contributions for the regional strategy

The medium-term strategic positioning of Lisbon includes an axis that is strongly committed to the knowledge society. The document covering the city's strategy, entitled "LX[Lisbon]-Europa 2020. Lisbon within the Framework of the Next Community Programming Period" states that the knowledge produced in the universities is absolutely critical for the full incorporation of the city into the knowledge society. In addition, as an objective, it defines the development of the link with universities and research centres, by establishing partnerships and joint projects and supporting the transfer of knowledge to the market.

In fact, Lisbon possesses an extensive network of higher education and research institutions, numbering, more precisely, over 100 higher education establishments, over 160 research units and more than 15,000 researchers. Every year, the city is host to thousands of international students in the different higher education cycles.

As an ISCTE-IUL research unit, CIES-IUL is integrated into this broader context and makes an active contribution as a Centre of excellence in the field of sociology and public policy and in other social science areas. It also benefits from this situation and contributes to it on the specific level of the internationalisation of research and third-cycle advanced training.

For its part, the CIES-UBI unit, which is located in the University of Beira Interior, in the Central Zone of the country, close to the Spanish border, is also integrated into the development strategy of the region. The University of Beira Interior set the goal of building a strong relationship with the region where i tis located, as well as to develop scientific partnerships with Spanish institutions, namely with the University of Salamanca and the University of Extremadura.

6.8 Opportunities for advanced training

CIES-IUL offers plentiful opportunities for advanced training linked to its research activities.

The Centre provides the scientific coordination for four PhD programmes: Sociology, Public Policy, Communication Sciences and Social Work. These programmes are attended by many dozens of students, whose theses are supervised by CIES-IUL researchers. A proportion of the students prepare their theses within the framework of ongoing research projects at the Centre. The PhD programme in Sociology, which completed 10 years of existence in 2013, has already produced dozens of PhDs. Some of them have been integrated into the Centre by means of postdoctoral grants or research contracts. We expect that a good number of the PhDs who qualify in the other three - more recent - programmes to join the CIES-IUL team as well.

Besides those four PhD programmes, CIES-IUL is a partner in a PhD programme in Urban Studies coordinated by the Universidade Nova de Lisboa and in an FCT PhD programme entitled "Communication Studies: Technology, Culture and Society", which expands the opportunities for advanced training.

Another aspect of the opportunities available is the fact that every year the Centre receives a large number of applicants for FCT PhD grants, many of whom have applied successfully. In 2012, the Centre team contained over 50 PhD students with FCT grants. The PhD programme in "Communication Studies: Technology, Culture and Society", as an "FCT PhD Programme", has the additional possibility of awarding a number of PhD grants directly to its students. Advanced training opportunities of a third type can be found in the "CIES-IUL Research Internship", established in 2012. These are unpaid training internships that allow 1st, 2nd and 3rd cycle students to join existing research projects at the Centre for a maximum period of six months, which may be renewed up to a consecutive maximum of two years. The students are supervised by the coordinator of the research project that they join and may use the empirical data produced by these projects in the preparation of papers, master's dissertations or PhD theses. The project coordinator and other researchers in the team are available to supervise these dissertations or theses. A significant number of students and research teams have attended these research internships and the Centre intends to increase this number in the next few years.

Finally, it is worth noting that the Centre plays host to a high number of Portuguese and foreign FCT post-doctoral grant holders, of which there were 30 in 2012. This is also advanced training, at the highest level, although these researchers are already capable of assuming scientific responsibilities independently, both in the supervision of PhD theses or master's dissertations, and the coordination of research projects.

6.9 Internationalization

Internationalization has been a fundamental strategic objective of CIES-IUL over the years that the Centre has been progressively achieving.Between 2008 and 2012, there was a highly positive development in the most important indicators of scientific internationalization.The Centre intends to maintain or reinforce these indicators in the period

2015-2020:

a)Research team:In 2012, 22% of the integrated PhDs were foreigners, from 16 countries.It is intended to maintain this percentage or possibly slightly increase it.It is also intended to increase the number of visiting researchers who, every year, want to stay at the Centre for short, or sometimes longer, periods.

b)Research projects and networks:Over the years, CIES-IUL has managed to participate in an increasing number of projects with international funding, in particular European projects.With regard to the EU Framework

Programmes, Centre researchers participated in 3 projects in the 5th Programme and 5 in the 6th Programme and are participating in 9 in the 7th Programme. The aim is to maintain this expansion within the framework of Horizon 2020. The Centre will also maintain its links with large international consortia such as the European Social Survey (ESS), in which it is a partner of the Instituto de Ciências Sociais of Lisbon University, which coordinates the Portuguese partnership. It is also worth noting the high participation in international networks (43 in 2012), especially COST-ESF ones, though also networks with researchers from Brazil, an involvement that it is intended to continue.

c)Publications:The number of articles published in international peer-reviewed journals has increased year by year and the Centre has already achieved a good ratio of articles per researcher. But there is still room to improve this ratio in the period 2015-2020.Another goal is to maintain or increase the level of publication of international books and book chapters. d)Activities of scientific debate:The objective is to maintain, in the future, the Centre researchers' high level of participation in and organization of international activities of scientific debate.

e)Advanced training activities:The 4 CIES-IUL PhD programmes represent a form of internationalization that has room to expand.Today, there are already foreign students and professors on these programmes, but the goal is to increase their numbers in the next few years.

f)The Centre's own publication channels:The journal Sociologia, Problemas e Práticas has followed a sustained course of internationalization. Its presence in SCOPUS since 2012 helps to reinforce its international visibility. The publisher Editora Mundos Sociais aims to broaden the distribution of its books to other Portuguese-speaking countries and publish more foreign authors. Regarding the regions of CIES-IUL's internationalization, the EU holds a special place, though cooperation with Brazil is growing and that with Portuguese-speaking African countries is beginning to emerge.

6.10 Knowledge transfer

First and foremost, the indication that the CIES-IUL profile includes applied research at a level of 25% is justifiable by the orientation of the Centre towards applied research in public policy.

For many years, the Centre has been carrying out research projects that, by means of direct commissions, or competitions arranged by government bodies, address issues related to the planning, design, implementation, monitoring and assessment of public policy in various fields of collective life. These projects deal with previously defined aspects of social and institutional life, in which diagnoses and recommendations for action, on the one hand, and assessments of the implementation and impact of policy measures, on the other, are requested of the research teams. For this reason, we can talk of the transfer of scientific knowledge to public institutions and, via this channel, the community in general.

At a time when European and Portuguese public policy is the object of far-reaching reflection and debate, CIES-IUL's ability to carry out research in this area can be seen as strategic and the knowledge transfer can be even more extensive.

Two factors will undoubtedly help the Centre to reinforce its ability in this area.

One is the fact that it provides the scientific coordination of a PhD Programme in Public Policy, attended at present by several dozen students. The knowledge produced within this programme, in particular in these students' theses, which cover a wide variety of topics, will offer the Centre more extensive and up-to-date means of action in this field. The other favourable factor is the expected growth of the social work area at the Centre, in the twin aspect of the research team and the PhD programme in this field, which is also coordinated by CIES-IUL. There is potential for a profitable articulation of the social work area with the sociology and public policy fields, which will tend to strengthen CIES-IUL's focus on these studies and the knowledge transfer associated with them.

6.11 Ethical issues

Social science research impacts on institutions and the community in general, at the social, economic, political and cultural levels. This impact is more directly visible, and also potentially more sensitive, in research applied to the field of public policy, an area in which CIES-IUL has long experience.

This impact is a reality, which means that Centre researchers cannot lose sight of ethical issues, at four basic levels: in the relationship with funding bodies and those that commission studies; in the relationship with the institutions and population groups that are part of the object of research; in the relationship with other researchers; in the relationship with the PhD and postdoctoral students who work under their supervision.

The Centre authorities - the director, sub-directors, Scientific Committee and research-group coordinators - must guarantee that ethical standards are maintained in the research carried out at the Centre, also taking into account the broader framework of the social responsibility of universities and research units.

The practical regulation of any ethical questions arising from the implementation of research or other scientific activities relies on the advice and written opinion of the ISCTE-IUL Ethics Committee. This was set up in 2011 and has already stated its position on requests for appraisal submitted by CIES-IUL in response to the requirements of the funding bodies of certain projects.

9.3. RESEARCH GROUP DESCRIPTION AND ACHIEVEMENTS FOR 2008/2012

9.3.1 Description of the Research Group

This research group focuses on the study of the macro, meso and micro-level processes related to social inequalities, migration and ethnicity, territories and environment, and cultural values and identities. Besides the analysis of the specificities of all these processes in the Portuguese society in order to understand them better, this group develops systematic international comparative studies, namely, but not exclusively, at the European level.

Group 1 is one of the largest in CIES-IUL. It is composed of 31 integrated researchers, 9 associate researchers and 12 research assistants. This team is a quite international one since 8 of the 31 integrated researchers and 4 of the 9 associated researchers are foreigners, from 8 countries. Most of the group members are sociologists, but there are also a good number of urban anthropologists and architects.

Some of the fields in which CIES has a leading position in sociological research at the national level are developed in this group. This is the case with social inequalities and migration and this led to the constitution, in 2008, of two permanent research platforms, the Observatory of Inequalities and the Observatory of Emigration. More specifically, the research fields addressed by this group are as follows:

a) Social classes and social mobility, especially processes of composition and recomposition of the Portuguese social structure and their consequences on cultural values, identities and life-styles in an European comparative approach b) Social inequalities of different types (socio-occupational profiles, levels of education, gender, ethnic background, age, income, levels of consumption, among others) systematically addressed on a national and international comparative basis through the Observatory of Inequalities.

c) Immigration and ethnicity, both at the level of the composition of international flux towards Portugal and at the level of the processes of social integration of migrants and their descendants in Portuguese society.

d) Portuguese emigration, at three different levels, through the Observatory of Emigration: i) the recent migration outflow from Portugal; ii) the social, cultural and political situation of Portuguese communities around the world; iii) the history of Portuguese emigration.

e) Cultural values, identities and attitudes, identifying patterns of permanence and change and understanding how they relate to socio-structural processes, at the national and international levels. This field of research is explored mainly through the participation of CIES-IUL and members of this group in the European Social Survey consortium since the very beginning of ESS

f) Cities and urban life, approached on the one hand through macro and meso-level studies and, on the other hand, through urban ethnographies.

g) Non-urban territories and environmental issues

In all these fields Group 1' researchers develop on a regular basis research projects funded through national and international competitive calls they apply to every year.

At the methodological level, statistics and large surveys, both national and international, are one of the fundamental tools in this group. Another one is qualitative research methods, such as in-depth interviews and ethnographical work. In line with CIES-IUL' team as a whole, members of this group carry on applied studies on specific public policy issues, such as migration policies, equality and anti-discrimination policies and urban policies.

Besides preparing and developing funded research projects, the members of this group perform other scientific activities. They publish papers in international peer review journals, as well as books and book chapters; they participate in and organize national and international scientific debates events; they supervise a good number of doctoral and master theses; and they contribute through different kinds of activities to the promotion of scientific culture.

9.3.2 Main achievements

In the period 2008-2012 this group reached very positive results in all the dimensions of its scientific activity. The main achievements of group 1 have been:

a) The research team grew substantially with the incorporation of new researchers from different scientific backgrounds. Three researchers with "FCT Ciência contracts", one researcher with a Marie Curie fellowship, several FCT post-doc grant holders and other researchers joined the group to work in ongoing projects and to start new ones. A good number of these researchers came from other countries which had a very positive impact in the internationalization of the group scientific activity.

b) A total of 39 research projects have been developed by the team members between 2008 and 2012 and these projects addressed all the topics covered by the research group. Of these, 11 were international projects in what concerns the funding and the teams' composition and five of them were large research projects involving teams of several European countries. Most of these 39 projects were won in competitive calls and others were commissioned by public and private institutions.

c) A major achievement of this group was the set up and consolidation of two permanent research platforms, the Observatory of Inequalities and the Observatory of Emigration. The Observatory of Inequalities has vast amounts of quantitative data for Portugal and Europe on a wide variety of social inequalities, analyses about the evolution of various inequality indicators, statistical documents, news, interviews and a large Portuguese and international bibliography. The Observatory of Emigration has systematic data on Portuguese immigrants in all the countries of the world, changes in their numbers over the years and their demographic profiles. It also offers analyses of emigration per country, a broad collection of news items on Portuguese emigration, interviews with specialists and public authorities and a large Portuguese and international bibliography on Portugal's emigrants in the world. There has been a growing demand for the data from these two Observatories from researchers, students and journalists.

d) The participation of members of the group in the Portuguese team of the European Social Survey international consortium since its very beginning should also be underlined. One of these members belongs to the Scientific Advisory Board of ESS.

e) The group members produced a large number (417) of scientific publications of different kinds, including: i) 67 articles in peer review journals, 42 of them are international journals; ii) 42 books, 11 of them were internationally distributed ones; iii) 75 book chapters, 27 of which were international.

f) The group integrated researchers, associated researchers and research assistants have been particularly active in what concerns the presentation of oral communications in scientific events, a growing number of which were international ones. Group members have also been directly involved in the organization of a good number of these scientific meetings.

g) Doctoral thesis supervision by group members should also be stressed. Between 2008 and 2012, 21 doctoral theses were completed under the supervision of researchers of this group and these theses address all the research topics covered by the group.

In brief, Group 1 improved all its scientific indicators in the five years under analysis, became a more internationalized research team and contributed substantially to the successful trajectory of CIES-IUL as a whole.

9.5. ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE AND OBJECTIVES OF THE RESEARCH GROUP 2015/2020

9.5.1 Structure of the Research Group

As all the other groups in CIES-IUL, Group 1 has a coordinator and a co-coordinator that are key researchers in the topics covered by the group. Their work is carried out in a close articulation with the Centre's director, assistant directors and Scientific Committee.

All the researchers in the group (as in all other groups) contribute to and are well informed about the annual Activity Reports and Activity Plans and they participate in the Scientific Council which approves these documents every year. Through this process every researcher is aware of the strategic goals set for the group.

Every year the group coordinator is invited to attend the annual meeting with the Permanent External Scientific Advisory Committee which appraises and issues an opinion about the Centre's activity and plans for the next year. The two permanent research platforms integrated in Group 1 - the Observatory of Inequalities and the Observatory of Emigration - have both their own director and also a Scientific Council composed of CIES-IUL's researchers and researchers from other institutions.

The contact between the coordinator and the co-coordinator with the group researchers and research assistants takes place on a daily basis and this is a very effective way by which all relevant professional information circulates, for example, information about opportunities for presenting applications to calls for research projects funding or calls for doctoral and post-doctoral grants or research individual contracts

When a request for an applied study related to the group research topics is addressed to the Centre by external institutions the Diretor informs the group coordinator who sets up a research team to answer to this request. The coordinator and co-coordinator of the group mobilize the researchers for presenting new research proposals to various kinds of calls at the national and international level as well as to organize regularly scientific debate activities. On the other hand any researcher in the group has the room to develop new ideas and is free to propose new scientific activities to the group coordinator.

The coordinator and co-coordinator and all the group researchers and assistant researchers have the permanent support of Centre's staff for all sorts of tasks related to the group activities.

9.5.2 Objectives of the Research Group

Group 1 is a large and consolidated group that makes an important contribution to CIES-IUL and it aims to keep this position and maintain or improve its scientific activity indicators in line with the track record between 2008 and 2012. The objectives of the group for the period 2015-2020 are as follows:

a) Maintain and if possible enlarge the research team and its level of internationalization by attracting new foreign researchers to work in ongoing projects and to develop new ones.

b) Maintain highly qualified research teams in all thematic and disciplinary fields covered by the group

c) Develop new research projects in all the fields covered by the group and explore new topics.

d) Increase the percentage of internationally funded projects through a strong participation in Horizon 2020 calls and other funding opportunities

e) Strengthen the work of the Observatory of Inequalities and the Observatory of Emigration. Inequalities is a never ending research field in contemporary societies and emigration became again a major issue in Portuguese society again. Besides the current work of collecting and analyzing relevant data on a national and international level, the two Observatories are expected to keep developing their own specific research projects, either fundamental or applied ones.

f) To maintain and important position in the European Social Survey (ESS) international consortium as a partner of Instituto de Clências Sociais of the University of Lisbon which coordinates the Portuguese participation. ESS became an ERIC in 2013 and this means consolidation and new research opportunities. More work can be done and more researchers and PhD and master's students are expected to explore the data made available by ESS.

g) Keep the capacity to respond to the demands of government bodies for public policy related applied studies. h) Maintain a good level of participation in international scientific networks (for example, COST networks) in order to keep up with new developments in the group research topics and to find partners for preparing strong applications to large international research projects.

i) Maintain a high level of scientific publication of all types, namely articles in peer review journals, books and book chapters.

j) Increase the number of articles in international peer review journals well placed in international rankings.

k) Maintain the high level of participation of group members in national and international scientific debate activities.
 l) Keep organizing national and international scientific debate activities within the fields of expertise of the group.

m) Keep up a strong connection between research and advanced training. A large number of doctoral theses were completed under the supervision of group researchers between 2008 and 2012 and this number is expected to grow in the years to come, covering all the topics the group works on.

n) Involve more 1° and 2° cycle students in research projects through the "CIES-IUL Training Internships", an advanced training promotion tool started at CIES-IUL in 2012.

o) Maintain the participation of researchers and research assistants of the group in the activities for the promotion of scientific culture performed annually by CIES-IUL.

9.3. RESEARCH GROUP DESCRIPTION AND ACHIEVEMENTS FOR 2008/2012

9.3.1 Description of the Research Group

This Research Group's main objective is to carry out high-level and innovative research on a focused although vast domain: knowledge and its relations with society. The Research Group pays special attention to formally codified information and knowledge and to the wide-ranging and far-reaching importance they have gained in present-days societies, as well as to the institutions, networks, actors and processes involved in the production, learning, communication and use of information and knowledge. Formally codified information and knowledge take different forms in contemporary societies, including writing and mathematics, science and technology, arts and humanities, organizational knowledge and media contents. It is also part of fundamental processes in the contemporary world, from education to communication, from production to consumption, from social interaction to institutional action, from social networks to social movements. Within this overarching domain, the Research Group's specific objectives have been: a) to design and conduct research projects on topics such as: adult literacy and key competencies; reading practices and reading policies; new technologies and new literacies; science in society and modes of relating to science; scientists and researchers' careers; youth and school: educational inequalities and education policies; students' trajectories and students' achievement in basic, secondary and higher education; lifestyle changes, communication practices and autonomy projects in the network society; journalists and the media system; b) to integrate these different research projects from a theoretical and methodological point of view, building a solid base of scientific understanding and research skills in this domain; c) to train highly skilled researchers in this field, in close connection with the doctoral and masters programmes held at the Lisbon University Institute (ISCTE-IUL), namely in sociology, communication, education and public policy: d) to link all this research effort with leading world-class researchers and the international scientific agenda, by establishing international research networks and engaging in international comparative research; e) to undertake activities promoting scientific culture, with special attention being paid to cooperation between the social sciences and the exact, natural and technological sciences; and f) to carry out background and evaluation studies for/of public policy in these areas. The Research Group has at its core some senior researchers covering the areas of literacy and competencies, education and higher education, science and society, internet and the network society, communication and the media. They coordinate research projects in these areas, participate in international scientific networks related to them and supervise post-doctoral researchers and PhD students. Besides participating in the projects coordinated by the senior members of the Research Group, the post-doctoral grant-holders are encouraged to submit their own proposals to funding agencies and to carry out independent research work. This Research Group has a strong commitment to integrating and training young researchers, particularly to supporting PhD students and producing PhD theses in the RG's areas of expertise.

9.3.2 Main achievements

Among the achievements of this Research Group it is important to underline the scientific results arising from a range of innovative and cumulative research programmes that are interlinked in the Research Group's broad, integrating domain: knowledge and its relationships with society. Besides their contribution to the understanding of specific phenomena and the advancement of the scientific agenda in that domain and its specialised fields, the research programmes and projects carried out by this Research Group have strong social relevance, often engage in interdisciplinary approaches and are coordinated with outstanding international networks. This is the case, namely, of the Research Group's achievements in the following areas: the research work on literacy and key competencies, which creatively combines intensive and extensive approaches, in line with and in connection to some of the most important international programmes in this area, such as the PIAAC (Programme for the International Assessment of Adult Competencies) and the PISA (Programme for International Student Assessment) programmes, promoted by OECD; the research projects on large scale public policy programmes concerning students' and families' reading habits and skills, on the role of school libraries and on the impacts of libraries networks, as well as on literacy (reading and writing), numeracy and the new literacies (e.g. digital literacy and information literacy), research projects carried out in cooperation with the main national agencies and foundations involved in these fields; the research projects on higher education, with innovative approaches of students' trajectories and students' access to and achievement in higher education institutions and programs, also with important policy impacts; the comparative research, carried out at the international level, on different European countries' education structures, institutions and policies; a range of research results that update and advance the sociological analysis of the relationships between schools, education, social inequalities and life-courses, in European and Latin American countries; the research on the different ways in which populations relate to science, with participation in international scientific networks, namely in the Ibero-American area, and in cooperation with important institutions in the areas of science and culture, e.g. the Calouste Gulbenkian

Foundation and the Ciência Viva (Science Alive) Agency; the research projects about the network society and the innovative approaches to its relationships with the media, as well as in relation to health systems and learning practices, in collaboration with some of the most important international scholars working on these topics (e.g. Manuel Castells) and with a leading participation in the World Internet Project; the participation in large interdisciplinary European projects and networks (NESS, FuturICT) connecting social, complexity and IT sciences; advancements in the area of the social studies of science and science policy (e.g., SSTNet, in Europe; scientific culture indicators, in Ibero-American networks; science policy programmes, involving the North-American area); the research on journalists as a professional group and the comparative study of different generations of journalists. In addition to specific contributions to the advancement of knowledge on a theoretical, methodological and empirical level, this Research Group has fostered the scientific training of young researchers and produced a considerable number of PhD and master's theses. It has also contributed very intensely to outreach activities, having established close ties of cooperation with public agencies and foundations in promoting scientific culture and science learning, literacy and other key competencies, lifelong learning, info-inclusion, and success at school throughout different levels of education.

This Research Group is organized at three levels: 1) coordinator (and co-coordinator); 2) integrated researchers (senior and junior PhDs); 3) other researchers (PhD students, research assistants, associated researchers). The core of the Research Group is composed by senior researchers covering the areas of literacy and competencies, education and higher education, science and society, internet and the network society, communication and the media. They coordinate research projects in these areas, participate in international scientific networks and supervise post-doctoral researchers and PhD students. The junior post-doctoral researchers, besides participating in the projects coordinated by the senior members of the Research Group, are encouraged to submit their own proposals to funding agencies and to carry out independent research work. This Research Group has a strong commitment to integrating and training young researchers, particularly to supporting PhD students and producing PhD theses in the RG's areas of expertise.

9.5.2 Objectives of the Research Group

Knowledge in its various forms, in particular formally codified knowledge, has a very strong presence in the contemporary society; furthermore, the foreseeable trends point towards a sustained increase in its importance. The focal objective of this Research Group is, precisely, to carry out high quality research and make relevant contributions to advancing our understanding of the multiple relationships between knowledge and society in the present-day world. Accordingly, the Research Group's specific research objectives for 2015-2020 are: a) to participate in updating theoretical and methodological approaches to literacy and the new key competencies of the information age and the knowledge society, in connection with state-of-the-art international research programmes such as PISA and PIAAC; b) to make new contributions to the use of mixed-methods in the analysis of public policies for promoting reading practices and increasing literacy levels among the population at large and in specific social groups; c) to launch new approaches to comparative and transnational research on the role and trends of education in face of the recent European crisis and the ways to overcome it, namely regarding economic development, innovation capacity, civic empowerment, social well-being and equality of opportunities (special focus on Southern Europe); d) to deepen and update research in the area of science and society, in directions such as the analysis of scientific culture, the integration of new generations of researchers in the science and innovation systems, the trends and issues concerning new forms of science communication and the sharing of scientific information (e.g. "the open science movement"), the reshaping of international scientific and higher education networks, as well as new interdisciplinary approaches on science, technology and innovation and between social, complexity and IT sciences; e) to undertake innovative research on the social transformations connected with IT use in different social contexts, groups and processes, with a focus on the Internet and its use in areas such as education, health, science and the media, as well as on the emergent skills, lifestyles, social networks, cultural values, social movements and institutional configurations related with these new kinds of technological tools and social relationships; f) to carry out research on students' social trajectories, school organization, education policy and educational achievement at basic, secondary and higher education, as well as on the connections between societal change and change in education systems, articulating extensive (statistical and institutional) with intensive (interactional and biographical) approaches; g) to contribute to greater knowledge of the media field, specific communication media, media contents and journalists as an occupational group in the IT age. This Research Group is strongly committed to pursue and increase interdisciplinary research and internationalization, in particular by leading and participating in European research networks applying to the Horizon 2020 calls. In combination with its research work, the Research Group also plans to keep producing high guality PhD theses, further strengthening the already close connection between CIES-IUL and the ISCTE-IUL's School of Sociology and Public Policy in the organization of its doctoral programmes, namely in Sociology, Communication Sciences and Public Policy. 9.3. RESEARCH GROUP DESCRIPTION AND ACHIEVEMENTS FOR 2008/2012

9.3.1 Description of the Research Group

Families, generations and health, and their relations to social welfare, are the focal subjects of this Research Group. The designation of the Research Group has recently been changed, to more clearly highlight the main subjects examined by this research team. Some of the more important transformations in contemporary societies, like the extended life span, the increasing presence of aging population and the emergence of new life styles, together with the current economic crisis interfering with consumptions and behaviours, demand the analysis of families and generations' welfare, of caring systems and health issues. This Research Group is committed to producing high standard sociological research supported by up-to-date theoretical and methodological approaches, enabling the advancement of scientific knowledge and informing social policies on domains such as: a) families, children, parenthood, intimate lives and new gender identities; b) youth, ageing processes, life transitions, generational pathways and life-course; c) family-work arrangements, new caring lifestyles and quality of life, social networksand social welfare; d) health and medicine health policy and regulation, risks, sickness and death; e) medical drugs' use, health cultures alternative medicines, self-medication, substance consumption and addiction. In the process of addressing these topics, the Research Group follows some main guiding lines, namely: i) to keep up-dated in relation to the international scientific agenda in its different fields of research and make use of advanced theories and innovative methods, both quantitative and qualitative; ii)) to continuously enlarge and strengthen the RG's national and international networks of collaboration with other researchers, scholars, scientific institutions, universities and specialized agencies, in order to carry out comparative research, participate in the frontier debates, apply to national and international calls and foster advanced training of master and PhD students. Several international research projects are carried out by this Research Group on the basis of a fruitful cooperation with international teams. Over the last years new international networks and new research projects, namely under the topics of generations, health, careand welfare, were settled with EU and North and South America universities, as well as with universities from emergent countries (Brasil, Russia, India, China and Turkey). Several applications to the Horizon 2020 programs are being prepared within the "Community, Work and Family", the "Quality" and the "Transitions" networks, as well as in the framework of the European Sociological Association (ESA), theInternational Sociological Association (ISA), the National Council onFamily Relations (NCFR/USA), and the Work and Family Researchers Network (WFRN). At the national level the co-coordination of the Observatory of the Family and Family Policies, as well as the seminars, projects and publications undertaken in collaboration with other scientific and higher education institutions have been important activities leading to theResearch Group's achievements. This Research Group onFamily, Generations and Healthmaintains a close co-operation with the master's and doctoral programsheld atthe School of Sociology and Public Policy of ISCTE-IUL,namely with themaster programErasmus Mundus MFamilyand its high-standard students coming from all over the world, who are encouraged to develop their thesesand benefit from advanced training under the framework of the Research Group. Several post-doc grant-holders and short-mission international high gualityvisiting researchers are also hosted by the Research Grouptakingpart of its different kinds of scientific activities.

The main achievements of this Research Group to be highlighted are the scientificout comes related with a set of intertwined research projects, conduced both at national and international levels by the members of RG Family, Generations and Health covering its corestudy domains. One first set of results to be underlined concernstransitions over the life course. Combining senior and young researchers, thisGroup has produced relevant new knowledgeabout transitions in the life course, in particular transitions adulthood, making use of innovative biographic methods and doing international comparative studies in collaboration with some European research networks. These studies included analytical dimensions which improved our understanding of subjects such as the present trends and recent changes in the transitions to employment and to parenthood, or insexualityissues and peer-group relationships, among others. A second important set of results has to do with work-family balance, gender roles and guality of life in contemporary societies, where aspects related with the growing presence of women in the labour market, as well as the improvements and shortcomings of public policies and employers' policies to support working mothers and fathers and promote a better quality of life, were analysed both at national and international levels, namely by means ofEuropean comparative research. A third relevant set of results were brought about by the research on health policies and health organizations, namely the analysis of tensions and changes concerning the relations between public health services, private health markets and health professionals. A fourth set of results coversthe diversified patterns and the emergent trends in the use of medicine drugs and other health practices, namely self-medication, and their connections with diversified life styles in different social segments. These studies on health and medicine also involve researchers of different generations working either in specific case studies or with national scope surveys, and also establishing international cooperation with academic institutions in Europe or in North and South America. Other achievements to be underlined are: a)the integration of young researchers to actively participate in either national or international research programmes and getting high-standard advanced training;b) the establishment of sustained international networks and partnerships with universities, research groups and other scientific institutions which constitute a ground for cooperation and for joint innovative research, publications and other scientific activities; c) the contribution of research results and accumulated scientific knowledge to inform policy makingand provide expert advice to government departments and the public administration. Particularly noteworthyare the cooperation with and the studies completed for, among other institutions: the Presidency of the Council of Ministers, on gender equality policy in public administration; the Parliament, on family policies; the Ministry of Labour and Social Solidarity, on policies for work-family balance; the Ministry of Education on the lifecourse of drop out students; the Drugs and Addiction Institute, on substances consumption; the European Commission, on employment in household services. Results of the research carried out by this Research Group are also being used as input for graduate and post-graduate teaching programmes, mostly at the ISCTE-IUL'sSchool of Sociology and Public Policy, including international programmeslike Erasmus Mundus MFamily, an internationalpartnership with European and non-European universities (U.Goteborg-Sweden, U.Stavanger-Norway, and U.Makerere-Uganda).

9.5. ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE AND OBJECTIVES OF THE RESEARCH GROUP 2015/2020

9.5.1 Structure of the Research Group

The organizational structure of this Research Group has three levels: a first one with the coordinator and the co-coordinator; a second one, composed by integrated researchers, both senior and junior PHD's; and a third level, which integrates research assistants, associated researchers and PhD students. Senior researchers play a central role within the research group main areas of family and gender, generations and life course, health and medicine, and social welfare. They run research projects, integrate international scientific networks, apply for national and international research calls, and supervise PHD theses and post-doctoral researchers. Junior post-doctoral researchers are integrated in research projects coordinated by senior researchers and are at the same time encouraged to apply for their own projects' funding, enabling them to achieve research autonomy. As mentioned in other sections, in order to obtain advanced training PhD students are involved in the RG's research projects, preparing their PhD theses within this framework.

9.5.2 Objectives of the Research Group

The objectives of this Research Group for 2015-2020 will be focused on producing advanced sociological knowledge, in line with the most up to date scientific agenda, on the implications of contemporary society dynamics on families, generations and health, with particular attention to care and welfare issues. It is a goal of this Research Group to constitute as research subjects for the next coming years current social changes such as: a) the increasing of life expectancy, the aging of population, new forms of experiencing intimate life and parenthood, the emergent trends in the use of medicine drugs and other health practices, namely self-medication, and their connections with diversified life styles in different social segments; b) the present economic crisis at national level and in the European space, namely concerning its particular manifestations in the southern European countries, interfering with family relations, transitions in life, health systems and health behaviours, caring practices and welfare structures. More specifically this Research Group aims at enabling the advancement of scientific knowledge and informing social policies, throughout the development of research that contributes for the analysis and understanding of: i) the current changes in the intertwined relations between transitions to employment and to parenthood, in intimate lives, sexuality issues and

peer-group relationships, and also to pay particular attention to emerging trends on what concerns transitions to different phases of aging, transitions to retirement and new forms of active retired life; ii) the improvements and pitfalls occurring with the present crisis on public policies and employers' policies to support working mothers and fathers and promote a better quality of life; iii) changing quality of life patterns and new ways of combining work and family life in countries where, like in Portugal, a huge amount of younger population is out of the labour market or work in precarious iobs, exploring new analytical models and new methodological approaches; iv) the current controversies taking place on health policies and health organizations, namely the tensions and changes concerning the relations between public health services, private health markets and health professionals; v) the diversified patterns and the emergent trends in the use of medicine drugs and other health practices, namely self-medication, and their connections with different life styles and social segments. The pursuing of these objectives will be done mostly with the international research networks in which the RG already participates and with which has already steady cooperation (see item 9.3.2). Some research projects recently approved will be carried out with these international networks. Despite the importance of these networks in which the RG already participates, one of the objectives of the Research Group for 2015-2010 will be to enlarge and reinforce its participation in international scientific networks with universities, research groups and other scientific institutions, namely in order to improve the chances of applications to Horizon 2020. As a matter of fact, the above mentioned research objectives of this GR for 2015-2020 are very much in line with some of the topics of the Horizon 2020 programme. Other objectives to be pursued are: the support to current PHD students enabling them to successfully conclude their theses; the launching of new research projects focused on the state of the art subjects and on the current scientific agenda both at national or international level for the advanced training of other PhD students and young researchers; the contribution of research results and accumulated scientific knowledge to inform policy making and provide expert advice to government departments and the public administration.

9.3. RESEARCH GROUP DESCRIPTION AND ACHIEVEMENTS FOR 2008/2012

9.3.1 Description of the Research Group

This is a group of researchers who share a common interest in the study of politics in Portuguese society and from a comparative perspective. Their work focuses on a variety of subject areas: democracy, governance and citizenship; political institutions; political parties; electoral systems and values, attitudes and behaviour; participation and social movements; elites and political culture, security and defence, public policy and political construction of the European Union. Its main goal is to foster research in the developing but still rather uncharted field of Portuguese social sciences by both promoting an interdisciplinary approach and seeking to achieve an increasingly international profile. This has been accomplished through a battery of more specific goals:

a) To perform innovative empirical research into the main Portuguese political institutions and processes;

b) To stimulate comparative research;

c) To build stable cooperative links with major international research networks;

d) To diversify funding sources by signing agreements with private and public sponsors;

e) To enlarge the research horizons of CIES-IUL by participating in open calls and international tenders, especially for European projects;

f) To enhance public information and understanding of political institutions and processes in a deliberate strategy of disseminating knowledge and project results;

g) To attract young researchers to the group by forming close links with universities, especially those associated with ISCTE's recently created political science and public policy undergraduate and graduate degree courses, with a view to achieving greater value added in terms of mobilising research capacity and resources.

9.3.2 Main achievements

Under this general strategy, the main goals that have been achieved are:

a) Involvement in major international academic networks continues to increase (from three in

2008 to nine in 2012):

b) The number of researchers involved significantly increased from 26 in 2008 to 35 in 2012. In particular there was a rise in the number of foreign assistant and senior researchers (e.g. five full time pos-doc researchers).

c) The number of ongoing projects of this research group from 2008 to 2012 totals 29 (12 of which have national and 17 have international teams). Most of these projects were won through open calls in public contests (20). For example, the "The agenda-setting in Portugal in a comparative perspective" project involves researchers of several nationalities (such as Greek, Spanish, Danish, and British) and represents the Portuguese case in the CAP (http:// www.comparativeagendas.info/). It is formed by four different lines of research, two of which have FCT funded projects.

d) The number of publications in international journals (60 in total from 2008 to 2012) significantly increased in this period: from 10 in 2008 to 20 in 2012, together with the rankings of the journals in which they were published (see 9.4.1). The number of books published also increased from four in 2008 to eight in 2012, along with the number of chapters in books (from 10 in 2008 to 12 in 2012).

e) Articulation between research and teaching within the relationship between CIES-IUL and the recently created (2010) Department of Political Science and Public Policy - ISCTE (DPSPP), was also consolidated:

- The undergraduate degree in Political Science (launched in 2007) finished its first cycle in 2010 with the academic assistance of members of this group. Since then, the course has been growing in success, to which this team has contributed significantly, both as lecturers and by bringing their research experience to classes, (the number of candidates has been rising significantly and some graduates are now assistant researchers in the research team);

- From 2008 to 2012 members of the group lectured in the master's degrees in Political Science and Public Policy (started in 2010);

- The group also cooperated in launching two new PhD in Political Science and Public Policy (started in 2011). Group researchers have participated in these programmes in different capacities, from full teachers to teaching assistants, research seminar discussants, supervisors and progress report evaluators. Doctoral candidates have been increasingly involved in the activities of CIES and the research group. - A variety of academic activities, including conferences and seminars were jointly

organised.

f) Three summer schools (SS) were jointly organised: the ECPR PhD SS "Europe in the World"

(18-30 June 2012), the ECPR SS on Parliaments (1-9 August 2012) and the European SS "Illicit

Drugs in Europe: Supply, Demand and Public Policies", with the European Monitoring Centre

on Drugs and Drug Addiction (2-13 July 2012).

g) A final mention goes to the eight new post-doc researchers who joined the group and

started their projects at CIES-IUL between 2008 and 2012. They are generally involved in the

project team, group activities, PhD seminars and co-authored publications.

9.5. ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE AND OBJECTIVES OF THE RESEARCH GROUP 2015/2020

9.5.1 Structure of the Research Group

The research group has a coordinator, Helena Carreiras, and a co-coordinator, Ana M. Belchior, who work in two different fields of research (Sociology and Research Methods and Political Science) and complement each other in the scientific areas covered. The group has 22 senior researchers from different fields, 17 of whom are eligible researchers whose time is mainly devoted to CIES-IUL as full time researchers or lecturers at ISCTE-IUL or other universities. Five are associate researchers devoting less time to cooperating in the centre's activities (30%) and the remaining 11 are assistant researchers that are the remaining members who are part of the centre's research project teams and other scientific activities. The proportion of members is expected to level out in 2015-2020.

The senior members are highly specialized researchers with a significant amount of international research output. They include nine non-national senior researchers.

Junior researchers belong to research teams and do work such as administrative support, data collection, organisation of conferences and seminars and training schools. In many cases they also participate in the writing of papers and conference presentations. Many of them are PhD students and four have FCT scholarships for their research.

This organisation allows the group to pursue its strategic goals and answer scientific questions, generally as follows: - Skilled, inter-disciplinary research teams are formed and usually also encompass junior researchers, stimulating their integration and training in the field of research (often in international research). These teams are expected to generate high-ranking publications in this period.

- The research team encompasses Portuguese and foreign senior researchers and nine out of the 22 are non-nationals. This composition fosters comparative research and internationalization of outputs. An increase in international exposure of research outputs is expected in 2015-2020.

- CIES-IUL openness to foreign researchers is also a way of promoting abroad the research carried out at CIES-IUL and increasing its opportunities for international exposure, which is a goal common to all research groups.

Each member will participate as follows:

Helena Carreiras and Ana Maria Belchior will be responsible for coordinating these goals and organising the annual seminar. All members of this research team who also lecture in the Department of Political Science and Public Policies-IUL at the School of Sociology and Public Policies-IUL (ISCTE-IUL) are expected to invite young researchers to participate in certain master's degree and PhD classes and they are strongly encouraged to accept the invitation. All research team members are invited to submit at least two articles a year to international journals, coordinate or participate in applications answering calls for FCT and European project proposals, include PhD candidates in their projects, focus on the excellence of their publications and take care in selecting the conferences they wish to attend. The supervisors of master's, PhD or post-doctoral students/fellows are expected to encourage them to publish and guide them into relevant, high-quality research. We will rely on the CIES-IUL administrative board to keep us informed of funding opportunities and publicise information on new post-doctoral positions.

9.5.2 Objectives of the Research Group

The group's goals for the future are:

a) To continue innovative empirical research on the main Portuguese political institutions and processes;

b) To stimulate comparative research by continuing the international expansion of the group's members and project teams;

c) To promote and achieve scientific excellence through a high number of publications, especially articles in international peer reviewed journals with high impact factors and in books from prestigious publishers;

d) To continue the process of building stable cooperative links with major international research networks (also to train junior researchers and to start their international exposure)

e) To increase and diversify funding sources by signing agreements with private and public sponsors;

f) To keep on broadening CIES-IUL's research horizons by participating in open calls and international competitions, especially for European projects;

g) To increase the political relevance of our projects by stimulating their orientation towards substantive social and political issues, especially taking account of EU Horizon2020 targets;

h) To maintain our strategy of improving the public information on and understanding of political institutions and processes using a deliberate strategy of disseminating knowledge and project results;

i) To attract young researchers to the group by forming close links with universities and generally promoting exchange

agreements with European and non-European universities (such as the University of Brasília);

j) To step up cooperation with other research lines within CIES-IUL, and include ISCTE-IUL's junior researchers in our research projects;

k) To consolidate national and international cooperation and deepen teaching and network cooperation within the School of Sociology and Public Policies-IUL (ISCTE-IUL).

The following methods will be used to achieve these goals:

The main methods for quality of research and publications will be participation in high-quality rather than lower-level conferences, endeavours to multiply opportunities to form international networks and active promotion of publications.
 To expand the number and quality of researchers, we propose to advertise post-doctoral positions as widely as possible, include PhD candidates in our research projects and invite colleagues with an excellent track record to join our research group.

3) For higher, more diversified funding, we plan to look at all private institutions' research needs in an attempt to match our expertise and research subjects with their specific interests. We will also look at European funds in particular.
4) We will promote activities that bring together researchers, practitioners and policy makers to discuss issues of common interest as far as the conception, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of public policies are concerned.
5) We plan to organise an annual seminar in which each member of the research line is invited to present his or her current work, in order to step up cooperation.

6) National and international cooperation will be developed by strengthening existing research networks and developing new partnerships.

The following results are expected for 2015/2020:

1) A good number of articles in top journals and books and an improvement in the use of open-access sources;

- 2) An increase in new members with PhDs;
- 3) An increase in funding available for projects and in projects funded by private actors and international programmes;
- 4) Regular cooperation with policy-makers;
- 5) The institutionalization of an annual seminar;

6) Membership of national and international networks and their involvement in programmes organised by the School of Sociology and Public Policies (ISCTE-IUL).

9.3.1 Description of the Research Group

Between 2008 and 2012, this research group pursued its main goal of bringing this area up to the same level as others at CIES-IUL, including international exposure of researchers and the centre. The following specific targets were set to achieve this:

i) Increase the number of researchers to improve the critical mass of accumulated knowledge;

ii) To focus on master's and PhD students as one of the sources of this recruitment;

iii) To increase the number of research projects whose teams include master's and PhD students in order to support their theses and integrate them into the Centre;

iv) To increase the number of publications, giving priority to international publications.

With this in mind, the group focused on the following:

a) In the area of the Sociology of Professions, three research projects studied nutritionists, geologists and teachers and a draft project was drawn up for a public call organised by the IEFP for professional trainers.

b) Studies on company modernisation included the use of new technologies, entrepreneurship and innovation.

c) Another set of studies was conducted in the area of labour markets;

d) The development of the services sector in societies and its impact on labour organisation, qualifications and work processes were the subject of research.

e) A public administration reform project was undertaken.

f) A research project on IT professionals' skills and the development of this sector in Portugal and other European countries.

g) An international project studied quality of life, including work as part of everyday life.

h) Other projects focused on disability.

i) There was a research project on innovation and science;

j) An innovative research project studied financial markets.

The research group continued to step up its main research topics: professions, labour markets, work and family, labour inequalities, professional and industrial relations and trade unions and enlarged its research interests to consider the changes in contemporary societies, therefore focusing on services, innovation, science and technology and financial markets.

There has been a decrease in the number of members of this research team due to the retirement of some researchers and the financial difficulties of hiring new ones. Considering the current number of members in the research group, its productivity, main outputs and continuous activity in quite recent research areas give every indication of a promising future.

9.3.2 Main achievements

The results achieved by this research line between 2008 and 2010 contributed to three areas in particular: knowledge accumulated in the research topics mentioned in the objectives, qualification of young researchers in this field (in postgraduate degrees and their inclusion in research projects), and international expansion of this research area as a strategic goal (via increasing presence in international scientific forums, publications, research teams, etc).

Some examples are:

1. More papers were presented by senior and younger researchers at international conferences and other scientific forums.

2. Two research projects conducted by international teams contributed to achieving these goals: "The Quality of Life in a Changing Europe" and "Follow-up of the Copenhagen Process: research into forms of individual career development and continuing vocational training".

3. Portuguese project proposals were submitted in public calls (Science and Technology Foundation), in particular: i) scientific development and entrepreneurial innovation, ii) sociology of financial markets and iii) state school teachers and their professional and labour associations: the reconstruction of identities and discourses.

4. The Observatory on Good Labour Practices, mainly focusing on action by social partners (trade unions and business associations), is constantly producing scientific knowledge plus up-to-date information for the general public. The Observatory is international in scope and analyses labour relations in Portugal, all Portuguese-speaking countries and other democratic countries (http://opbpl.cies.ISCTE-IUL.pt)

5. Also the Observatory of Social Inequalities makes important contributions in the area of work, employment and the labour market, including workers' education-skills and competences, producing important scientific knowledge, information, up-to-date bibliographies and databases and doing other work that can be included in this line of research (http://observatorio-das-desigualdades.cies.ISCTE-IUL.pt/).

6. The master's and PHD theses completed last year in this area are described below. The master's degree course in Sciences of Work and Industrial Relations, within the scope of the European Master's in Labour Studies, made a significant contribution to this goal. This master's course is offered by the ISCTE-IUL Sociology Department, which has been following a policy of more integration between research and teaching, during the restructuring of Portuguese

universities under new higher education legislation.

7. In addition to these contributions, other research projects are relevant to the advancement of theoretical, methodological and empirical knowledge in this research group, in particular those on labour market regulation, new organisational models (including public administration and new public management), professional profiles, new professional groups, working conditions, precariousness and unemployment, entrepreneurship and gender and generational segregation in the labour markets.

8. The 2009 CIES Research Forum, Sociological Views of Employment: Industrial Relations, Firms and Professions, was entirely devoted to this research line. It was open to the scientific community and general public and had a high media impact. This initiative gave us an overview of the knowledge accumulated in this research and helped define our goals for the future more effectively.

9. The research group's main achievements are considerable if we consider its size and the changes that have been taking place, with the retirement of some of its members and the development of new, topical research subjects.

9.5. ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE AND OBJECTIVES OF THE RESEARCH GROUP 2015/2020

9.5.1 Structure of the Research Group

The research group is organised by research topics and projects based on the strategic aims described in 9.5.2 below. The researchers conduct their research in the following broad areas:

- Labour market
- Unions and professional relations
- Sociology of markets, financial capitalism and economic sociology
- Innovation, knowledge, science and technology
- Professions and occupations
- Work, employment and unemployment
- Work and gender
- Work and social inequalities
- From industry to services and new technologies
- Work and cinema

The researchers organise themselves freely within each of these subjects. They submit research proposals to tenders, respond to requests from civil society, disseminate knowledge in conferences, workshops, seminars, etc. and publish in Portugal and abroad.

Other level of organisation is each research project, coordinated by one researcher. Each researcher is responsible for the team and also contributes to the training of younger researchers.

In addition to its division by research topic and research project, the group also articulates with each researcher's work

in supervising master's, PhD and post-doc researchers and invites them to collaborate in projects. This is also possible even at graduate level through the CIES-IUL short-term traineeship programme.

The coordinators of the research group, Luísa Oliveira and Luísa Veloso, keep the researchers up to date on funding opportunities, collaboration with national and international partners, etc. They also participate in CIES-IUL's promotion of outreach activities.

The research group has regular meetings to define the main research topics. As new research topics are developing (see 9.5.2), the group is still reorganising and, as some of its members have retired and others have reduced their workload, it will take some time to achieve a solid body of knowledge in the newer research topics, as opposed to those in the more traditional research fields, such as professions or unions. These newer topics will make it necessary strengthen the international dimension, which will be done by submitting new research proposals for international funding and researchers' attendance at international conferences, seminars, workshops, etc.

In organisational terms, this research group will be strengthening its team by recruiting more researchers from the national pool of master's and PhD students and the international arena, if this is possible in terms of financial support. This goal is essential in increasing the number of research projects, so that research teams specialised in the different areas can be formed. Another goal is the pursuit of international expansion by improving the international research teams engaged in each project, which is a good way to establish networking. This will be another level of the research group's organisation, which will continue to increase national and international peer-review publication and foster mobility for researchers to present papers at international conferences and other scientific meetings.

9.5.2 Objectives of the Research Group

Given that structural changes are occurring in societies, we are witnessing weakness and change in industrial culture, skills, traditional businesses and other institutions that have been central to the Sociology of Work. At the same time, new science-based industries and companies, innovative products and processes, new technologies, companies' new production and use of knowledge and new professions, skills and cultures are emerging.

This line of research has recently introduced new subjects broadly known as innovation studies, entrepreneurship and the social construction of markets. This includes financial markets in line with the latest developments in international sociology research areas, known as Sociology of Markets and Sociology of Financial Markets. This is also the reason why the line has changed its name to Work, Innovation and Social Structures of the Economy.

Some traditional research subjects remain, such as industrial relations, trade unions, professions and employment, including the new forms of labour market regulation. A project on representations of work in cinema was also approved recently and will allow to broaden research in articulation with other fields.

All these subjects together constitute the future agenda for this line of research and this centre.

Our specific objectives for the future are:

a) To develop innovation studies by analysing R&D in companies, focusing on producing new knowledge and transferring it from universities and other R&D institutions

b) To understand the social construction of markets is particularly important when firms have a new product to sell, which is one of the reasons why we will analyse technological start-ups

c) To develop the sociology of financial markets by analysing how concrete markets function, who the real faces and social actors behind the word "market" are, how they relate to each other, how financial workers do their jobs, what their work instruments are and how they are used, with a dual goal in mind: i) to help open this black box for a better understanding of our societies; ii) to place financial organisations and workers on the sociology of work agenda
d) To continue studies in the Sociology of Professions, with particular attention to the emergence of new occupations and their impact on labour market segmentation.

e) To continue research on labour market issues, such as emergent forms of regulation and employment policies, the need for new skills to keep up with the transformations in economic activity and new science-based-industries and to analyse the dynamics of precariousness in the labour market

f) To further studies of industrial relations, trade unions' adaptation to new realities in companies and labour markets. These goals will be achieved with research projects, such as:

1) Scientific development and entrepreneurial innovation, funded by the FCT

2) Sociology in financial markets: system architecture, societal impacts, forms of rationality, dispositional and contextual plurality, funded by the FCT

3) Observatory on Good Labour Practices, focusing on action by social partners (trade unions and business associations) and permanently producing scientific knowledge in this area and up-to-date information for the general public, funded by the Independent Trade Union Association.

This line of research is facing some difficulties in terms of its future, mainly due to the retirement of some of its members (e.g. João Freire and António Dornelas).

In view of the number of projects in this line, we can conclude that its research activity is quite intense and is expected to grow in the future, due to the urgent need to reflect on issues such as the economy, the work and employment crisis, the knowledge society, financial capitalism, etc.

9.5.1 Structure of the Research Group

The Modern and Contemporary History Group will be in contact with the Director and the CIES Scientific Committee, from which it will receive guidelines that it will endeavour to follow. It will be divided into theme-based work teams in order to provide an effective response to the challenges posed to scientific research. Its inclusion in the CIES will strengthen interdisciplinary ties and its members will seek to join trans-disciplinary groups. In accordance with the directives set out in its strategy, its focus on interdisciplinarity will also help to create synergies in work with researchers from other institutions. Its members will be more than willing to join groups, networks and associations in the same scientific area, such as Associação Portuguesa de História Económica e Social. It will maintain its connection with the Contemporary History Network, to which it already belongs, and help to prepare its activities. It will also devote its attention to international contacts developed over the years by its researchers. In addition, it will look for new networks that will enable it to respond to international calls. The researchers in the Modern and Contemporary History Group will hold periodic seminars to discuss common questions and present research results. They will also help to choose, implement and assess research strategies.

9.5.2 Objectives of the Research Group

Diversity of methods and subjects is essential in the strategy of the Modern and Contemporary History Group. Its researchers study a variety of subjects and use methods and scales of analysis appropriate to their fields, with history

as the unifying factor. The times, sojourns and dynamics associated with them are the unifying factor of their research. Diversity is a guarantee of vitality and the emergence of new perspectives that go beyond the state of the art and produce new knowledge. Our researchers use the scientific and methodological capital accumulated over decades of work in common and aggregating subjects in the fields of political and cultural history, urban history, history of society and economic and technological change, history of the dynamics of modern empires and colonial and post-colonial history. Their research will cover topics such as local history, history of outcasts and marginalised people, history of social, political and economic resistance and history of occupations.

The Modern and Contemporary History Group wishes to contribute to the advancement of knowledge in its subject area, social development and cultural dissemination in the history of recent centuries from a comparative perspective in permanent touch with other social sciences.

It will focus on conceptual and methodological integrity and diversity in scales of analysis. It will favour a reflexive approach to historiography by welcoming collaboration with researchers from other disciplines, along with transnational research and comparative studies. The group is determined to avoid teleological views.

In addition to its current projects, the group hopes to join research work in which its researchers may collaborate in groups headed by others or lead their own projects in order to foster cooperation with other researchers.

It will endeavour to ensure that this research leads to international cooperation and involvement with researchers in the same or different subject areas in Portugal. It will not shrink from the challenges of projects that must meet international quality standards.

It will uphold the importance and study of memory in the structuring of societies. To this end, it will contribute to the production, preservation, dissemination and contextualisation of the historical documentation essential to high-quality scientific research.

It will seek partnerships with civil society institutions for the transfer of knowledge and assessment of the social impacts of the results of its studies, while never losing focus on the role of memory in the formation of social entities and its contribution to reflexive, inclusive societies.

12. STRATEGIC PROGRAMME AND BUDGET RATIONALE 2015/2020

12.1 Overall budget rationale

CIES-IUL is a large-scale, competitive and increasingly internationalised research unit of excellence, whose main fields are sociological research and the study of public policy. It also possesses researchers in the fields of political science, communication sciences, education sciences, urban studies and social work. The integration of a group of key researchers in modern and contemporary history, from 2015, will reinforce the Centre's team.

This is the basis on which CIES-IUL has defined its strategic programme for 2015-2020. The Centre intends to maintain or improve the various indicators that earn it the status of excellence, i.e. it intends, in particular: i) to boost the research team and the percentage of foreign researchers belonging to it; ii) to continue to raise the number of funded projects, especially those that obtain international funding; iii) to continue to increase the internationalization of its researchers' publications; iv) to further strengthen the links between research and advanced training; v) to consolidate its own publication channels; vi) to continue its activities for promoting the scientific culture.

Against this background, and in line with the Centre's practice in earlier years, the budget for the strategic programme now being presented will continue to be aimed at creating and consolidating the means to carry out the team's research activities.

All the objectives described above have an impact on the budget. Naturally, this impact is greatest in the human resources component, given the need to expand the research groups with new PhDs who will take care of projects of great importance to the Centre, as is the case with the Observatory of Inequalities and the Observatory of Emigration. The component involving the internationalization of activities also requires substantial budget support, whether for researchers' trips to important scientific meetings abroad or high-quality translation services (for articles to be published in international journals and for project proposals involving funding applications) or again for researchers' trips abroad to meetings aimed at preparing international applications.

The total budget is €5.935,234, current expenditure is forecast to amount to a total investment of €4,789,529.00, which is divided between the acquisition of various services (€626,712), human resources (€3,465,393), travel (€562,656) and consultants (€134,768), plus overheads (€989,205) and equipment (€156.500).

Under the heading of the acquisition of services, the expenditure is essentially to support the internationalisation of the unit, by means of support for the translation not only of papers to be presented at conferences and in scientific publications, but also projects applications to be submitted to different funding sources. The reformulation/updating of all the unit's websites is provided for, along with that of its administrative information management system and the associated monthly maintenance. Also included is the provision of services for the occasional support of the unit's activities, in particular support for the Communication and Planning Office and the research activities carried out. Similarly, the continuation of publication of the journal Sociologia, Problemas e Práticas has been taken into account. Under the heading of human resources, it is planned to maintain the technical and administrative staff of the Centre and recruit nine new postdoctoral researchers.

The amount allocated to "Travel" is part of the Centre's internationalization policy, in particular through the presence of its researchers abroad and the hosting of foreign researchers. CIES-IUL will continue to give financial support to researchers in the form of travel allowances for the presentation of papers at international meetings and for preparatory

meetings aimed at drawing up projects or establishing international research networks. Moreover, it intends to continue bringing international researchers to the Centre to hold conferences.

The heading 'consultants' essentially includes the cost of organising the scientific meetings promoted by members of the Centre and the expenditure connected with the Permanent External Scientific Advisory Committee. Under the heading of equipment, the total investment provided for amounts to €156,500. This figure corresponds to the expenses forecast for the creation of new workstations, in accordance with the increase in the number of research projects and postdoctoral and PhD grant holders. It also covers the purchase of software licences, in particular MaxQda and Endnote.

12.2 Human Resources rationale

The sum allocated to "Human Resources" corresponds to salary and training expenses for the seven staff members belonging to the various CIES-IUL services: the Financial and Administrative Services; the Communication and Planning Office; and the journal Sociologia, Problemas e Práticas. All these services consist of highly qualified staff, all with a higher education (undergraduate or master's degree) and specific training courses in their particular area of work. The budget comprises wages, vacation and Christmas subsidies, per diem expenses, employer's costs with social security (TSU) included and personal risk insurance.

This sum also includes 9 postdoctoral grant holders (comprising a monthly grant, voluntary social insurance contributions and personal risk insurance). They will be distributed in the Centre as follows:

Research Group 1: Two grants (2015-2020), one allocated to the Observatory of Inequalities and the other one to the Observatory of Emigration. With the mission of assisting the research teams of both Observatories, these postdoc grant holders' main tasks will be to edit scientific and information material produced by the Observatories, undertake research activities and cooperate in the Observatories' outreach activities.

Research Groups 2 and 4: A grant each from 2015 to 2020. These two postdoc grant holders will reinforce the scientific work of both research groups and are expected to develop new project proposals and other scientific activities. Research Group 3: A grant from 2015 to 2020 and another from 2016 to 2020. These two postdoc grant holders will reinforce the scientific work of this research group and are expected to develop new project proposals and other scientific activities.

Research Group 5: Two grants from 2015 to 2020 and one from 2016 to 2020. These three postdoc grant holders will reinforce the scientific work of this research group and are expected to develop new project proposals and other scientific activities. The reason for allocating three postdoc grant holders to this specific group is that some researchers retired recently and the group's team needs to be extended.

12.3 Equipment rationale

Under the heading "Equipment" the total investment provided for is €156,500. This figure corresponds to the expenses forecast for the creation of new workstations, in accordance with the increase in the number of research projects and postdoctoral and PhD grant holders. It includes the purchase of the desktop and laptop computers necessary for the fieldwork and for the activities relating to the internationalization of the team. The purchases are provided for on an annual basis in accordance with the development of the number of full-time researchers at the unit. We also provide for the acquisition of software licences, in particular MaxQda and Endnote.
